## Statement to Our Beloved Community Members Affected by Conflict in the Middle East

The HRDEIC acknowledges the trauma, grief, fear and suffering resulting from the violence and humanitarian crises unfolding in the Middle East, and the impacts felt around the world, including here in the Wayland community. We hold close to our hearts our Israeli, Palestinian, Muslim and Jewish friends, family, neighbors and colleagues, and other community members directly affected by the trauma, particularly those who have lost loved ones. We encourage everyone in Wayland to acknowledge what those most directly affected may be experiencing, ask how they are doing, listen to how they are feeling, and show the compassion and support so needed now.

We believe that what binds our community together is greater than what separates us. We call on people of all ages to work together toward peace in the Wayland community and to reject dehumanization, polarization and hatred, including Islamophobia and antisemitism.
